Hello all

There seems to be a lot of activity around the club at the moment with an imminent State Pattern Championship on 19 and 20 March, plus the promise of the APA National Pattern Championship in June. With so much to write about to fill the report, perhaps I'll be brief instead and concentrate on only one matter.

At the last Committee meeting, we considered a proposal to help run a Tasmanian Nationals in 2007 (South Australia look like hosting the 59th Nats in 2006). The last (and only) time Tasmania did this was the 11th Nationals, held at Campbell Town in 1957-58. The competitions making up the Nationals include the disciplines of radio control, free flight and control line, with all the various divisions within each (aerobatic, scale, indoor, etc). So with a large number of different competitions it becomes a real challenge to stage such an event, both from the point of view of the logistics as well as the number and variety of venues to required to run all the competitions.

Most would probably agree that it would be fantastic to see top fliers competing at Nats level, but make no mistake, it would require a huge amount of work by many people. To adequately plan ahead would mean a small team of people working almost fulltime from now until 2007, plus a larger team as time for the event drew closer. And this is where things could get very difficult. LMAC is a very small club by mainland standards and within the club as a whole, a lot of the work (for anything) is only done by a "core" of interested members. The Committee therefore feels that it would be impossible to harness the required resources to run something like the Nats, especially when other states have declined to run them in the past.

Moreover, collectively the number of venues in Tasmania is relatively small, and I would venture the opinion that for something like outdoor free flight, we actually have no suitable venue in this state at present. Nor do we have any real demonstrated interest (as a club, which is) in any disciplines other than radio control. It seems some members have come to believe (wrongly, I feel) that aero modelling radio control. For all these reasons, your Committee decided that we could not run, nor help to run, a Nats in Tasmania in 2007. Now on the other hand, if there was a sudden and huge groundswell of interest with promises of much help, well then., look forward to seeing you all at the flying field.
