EDITORIAL:

Welcome to the April issue of Prop Torque, which you will find is a little different from the usual. The reason is that we are looking at how sustainable the Newsletter is, in its present form.

At the outset we wish to reassure readers that Prop Torque is not under threat – it will continue – but we need to look carefully at what we do and how it is done.

The cost of printing and mailing Prop Torque in its present form is about \$70 per issue, depending on how many pages it has. In the past, production costs were largely offset by revenue from advertising. Unfortunately this revenue has almost dried up since hobby outlets now use the Internet to conduct their business. As a result LMAC is spending more than \$700 per year to print and Post Prop Torque. This is not sustainable in the long term.

The Committee has looked at a number of options for Prop Torque, ranging from keeping things as they are, through to changing to a bi-monthly newsletter, and even to issuing only a very small single-page newsletter. However, we all agree that Prop Torque should stay, but that changes must be made and that members must have input on this matter. So Prop Torque will be on the agenda of the AGM on 5 June.

To start the ball rolling, your editors have tried to keep this issue as small as possible, consistent with continuing to provide the information you need. For example, we have, for this issue at least, omitted the double photo page (the "centrefold"). We have justified this because there is good photographic coverage of club events on the club's Web page. However, we also recognise that this puts those members without Internet access at a disadvantage. Let us know what you think.

Another reason for not having the photos is that your editors have found that with our relatively simple software, processing images for publication is a tedious business, and omitting the photos will simplify production. A related issue is that of succession – we will find it hard to convince other goodly souls to take on the job of newsletter editor(s) if the job is seen to be too tedious or too technical. We definitely do not want to deter other members from offering their services as editors in the future!

Starting with this month's issue, we will no longer be mailing printed copies to club secretaries; they will receive their copy of Prop Torque by e-mail. This raises the issue of our members receiving Prop Torque the same way, although it has been available for downloading from our Web site for some time. We want to canvass members' opinions on this (see Announcements). Please let us know.

Since this editorial has covered so much ground (and taken up so much space) there is no Captain's Report in this issue.

We hope that you enjoy this issue.

Members are also reminded that the deadline for getting their wing status is 1 June, not the end of June, and if you have not for some reason obtained at least your bronze wings by then you will only be able to fly your model in the presence of one of the club instructors.

On the Easter weekend we held the State Scale Championship at the field in windy conditions. The Championship was to be held Saturday & Sunday, but due to the weather and some flyers not being able to return on Sunday the comp was reduced to one day only. All competitors flew at least one or more of their models with only a couple of mishaps on the day. The Wellington Bomber flown by Peter Lucas lost one engine during his second flight and took a spiral into the ground. This was a magnificent model, which got a first in the Static section. Peter had said that the model was not an easy one to fly in windy conditions. This model has been repaired several times before and most likely it will be rebuilt again, it would be shame to lose a great model like this one. Kevin Hay with his outstanding Ultimate ARF displayed some great flying skills in two flights, the sound of the DA100 engine made it like the real thing and that's what it's all about. During Kevin's second flight the engine suffered a flame out due to a technical error on Kevin's transmitter kill switch. This meant a dead stick landing in very windy conditions with such a large model, but well done to Kevin he landed very heavy taking out the undercarriage it could have been worse. It was not a good day for Kevin as the Sea Fury lost a wheel in flight, which forced him to belly land in the long grass with the undercarriage retracted lucky for Kevin very little damage. We had a good roll up at the field and everyone seemed to enjoy the day despite the weather. Thanks to Geoff for the trophies and judging; also to Cliff and Kerry for sitting in the judges chairs in the cold all day. Thanks also to Chez Rogers for his help with the scoring, events like this cannot be successful with out the help of other club members many thanks to all. Many thanks to the canteen ladies as Robin was not well on the day and it would not have been possible with out the ladies' help... We are coming to a close on the contest calendar for this year with the 7 Cell event on Saturday 20 May and the All Models day Saturday 17 June.
