Hello everyone

A lot has been happening lately on the Club front and your Committee has been hard at work making all the right decisions and protecting every one of your interests – right? Well, it's true that we have been hard at work, but we get little or no direct feedback from the membership. So while it is true that the Committee *thinks* that it is protecting all your interests, we don't really know if you don't tell us what *you* think.

One thing that took quite a bit of time was modernising the club's Constitution. This was necessary for two reasons: the way it was written was generally outmoded and (far more important) in some areas it could have left the way open for legal and tax problems in the future. The new Constitution follows very closely the Model Rules for Associations such as ours. It should be said that the Secretary has done the lion's share of the work, for which everyone should be most grateful.

The next step is that the general membership must review and approve the new Constitution. Accordingly, a Special General Meeting has been called for 14 May at 1:30pm, at the LMAC clubhouse. All members are invited and you should make a real effort to attend. Now, so that you won't feel the day could be wasted, we are also holding a Working Bee (long overdue) starting at 9:00am, followed by a BBQ lunch and then by the meeting.

Copies of the new Constitution will soon be available at the Clubhouse (if anyone wants an email copy, please ring the Secretary). So when you are next at the field, read through the draft and familiarise yourself with it. A couple of things to bear in mind: there is no such thing as a perfect Constitution and the vote at the SGM doesn't have to be unanimous. So, there only needs to be a majority in favour to approve it. I mention this so that we avoid undue and irrelevant argument on the day.

Another thing is that the AGM will be held at the LMAC Clubhouse at 1:30pm on 11 June, the week after the TMAA AGM (when we find out what the MAAA fees will be). The AGM will be held independent of any flying activities, so weather will not be an issue. Please do all you can to attend.

At the last meeting the Committee set the prices for all food items sold at the Canteen. The prices will be placed on the noticeboard and will apply until further notice. Details can be found elsewhere in this newsletter. The Committee has tried to avoid price increases so the Canteen is a service to members, but at the same time being financially responsible.



Finally, I would like to encourage contributions to the newsletter. We have got out of the way of having technical articles, hints and tips, etc. It is not the Editor's responsibility to provide material; it is our newsletter and it is our contributions that should go into it. So how about it - put pen to paper, all you budding authors!

Well, that is all for now. I look forward to seeing you all at the flying field.

#### Hi Everyone,

## **Tasmanian Pattern Championships 2005**

It was great to see fliers from all parts of the state participating in the Tasmanian Pattern Championship at Symmons Plains on March  $19^{th}$  and  $20^{th}$ . The new flight line, arguably among the best in Australia, had light crosswinds both days with the weather otherwise sunny and perfect. The (unexpected) watering and rolling of the new strip had produced a good level, dust-free surface; side fences proved challenging for some but these are targeted for removal by the landowner.

Saturday, flying commenced at 10.00am with Line Director Cliff Walters keeping a steady flow of competitors to the flight line over both days. Sportsman entrant and junior flier Daniel Port confessed to not having flown the schedule until the week before. Nevertheless, he was the standout flier over the weekend showing considerable improvement over the two days to finally finish second. He was not even put off by having to fly minus his muffler until the LMAC team came to his rescue with threaded rod, much to his helper's relief – we suspect helper Mike Ralph's ears may still be ringing! Sportsman Andrew McEntyre's suprise first round knife edge landing unfortunately ruined his aircraft's trim for the rest of the day. Sunday morning, aircraft retrimmed, Andrew produced the highest individual Sportsman score of the competition and looked set to provide a strong challenge to Daniel and Paul. Unfortunately, his engine had other plans, expiring (big-time and permanently) in his last flight.

Advanced proved to be the competition to watch with the two competitors running neck and neck on both days; final results were separated by only 2.08 points in Steve Reece's favour. Expert and Masters fliers continued with the high standard of competition – looking good for the future of aerobatics in Tassie.

Sunday afternoon, trophies were presented with Australian Pattern Association (APA) President, Rob Clarke, also presenting Daniel Port with a youth encouragement award of APA membership and goody bag. Peter Kidson took out the most sought after prize: the Easter egg raffle. Many thanks to sponsors Roj's Hobbies, Melbourne, Tates Performance Hobbies, Geelong, Steve Ralph Models, Devonport and Hudson Civil Products, Launceston. Your support of these sponsors would be appreciated. Thanks also to CD Andrew McEntyre, all helpers and the canteen team for keeping everyone well-fuelled over the weekend.



At this point in time, the APA Championships are scheduled to be flown at LMAC's Symmons Plains site later this year on June 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. The APA has indicated a minimum of 25 fliers would be needed to make it a viable proposition, with approximately half of this number expected to come from the mainland. Tassie has shown it can field a quality group of entrants and we look forward to a high level of support from our fliers in this, and future, pattern events.
