Venues have not yet been discussed. Whether this idea gains any traction will depend entirely on you, the members, showing your interest and making a commitment to participate. Based on the "show of hands", the committee will then look into a suitable venue, types of models and appropriate rules, etc. If you are interested, please contact Greg Robertson.

This the home page for the Mud Duck, a model that was around quite a while ago, but went off-line for a number of years. It has some terrific advantages claimed for it: it flies very slowly on low power and is good for rough fields. The new line of kits (plans also available) include one of 108-inch wing span, with a top speed of 15mph (24km/h) on a 91 four stroke! Who knows, we might see some 'Ducks at Symmons Plains next season!

New Cheap 2.4 GHz equipment.

In the latest Airborne, 231, he announced that the system called FlyDream is now approved by the MAAA for our use, having passed all the statutory tests, it is now therefore been included in MOP058. 
Rose Bay, Sydney and flying boats.





FIG 1-2 THREE VIEW DIMENSIONAL DIAGRAM - SEAPLANE
